EGMONT

- A high-level multidisciplinary course in security and defence matters, structured around:
 - * 10 monthly residential seminars of two days, each focussing on a specific issue:
 - * 10 visits to Belgian institutions active in the field of security and defence.
- 30 Belgian participants (auditors):
 - * 12 senior officers or civilians employed by Belgian Defence;
 - * 18 senior managers or officials whose professional activity has an explicit link with security or defence, working for different public services or international institutions, in civil society, with an economic, industrial, political or academic background, etc.

- ⇒ the visit dates are fixed at least one month beforehand







Practical details

- ⇒ Where? Campus Renaissance (Royal Military Academy), Rue Hobbema 8, 1000 Brussels
 ⇒ When? From September 2019 to June
- ⇒ When? From September 2019 to June 2020, once per month from Friday 9 a.m. until Saturday 6 p.m. The auditors are accommodated on-site.
- Costs? 950 € (for non-Defence participants)





- ⇒ Applications, in the form of a CV and a letter of motivation
- ⇒ Registration opening: November 2018
- ⇒ Registration closure: 31 January at 11.59 p.m.
- ⇒ Selection interviews from December 2018 to February 2019
- ⇒ Selection by the HSSD steering committee in late April 2019
- ⇒ Auditors list approval by the minister of Defence in June 2019



Use of languages

- ⇒ The auditors use their mother tongue (French or Dutch)
- ⇒ The speakers use French, Dutch or English
- ⇒ A more than passive knowledge of these three languages is therefore essential
